Have you ever wondered what it would be like to be a pioneer? At Pioneer Camp, you will find out! During this week-long camp, students will dress, work and play just as children did in pioneer times!

Students entering grades 3 – 6 (ages 8-11) will enjoy age-appropriate educational and recreational activities. Historical interpretation, hands-on demonstrations and skills, crafts and games, all based on the 1840s time period, and using the tools and techniques of that time. Each camp will have a maximum of 20 students to ensure individualized attention and learning opportunities. Each session focuses on a different aspect of 19th-century life.



Session I will focus on science, technology, engineering and math 19th-century style

Session II will feature our traditional camp activities.

Session III will focus on the fine arts and music.

Session IV will focus on 19th-century foodways.
